Put your company logo on...

Your company logo (must be a jpg) can appear on the Plant Briefs report found in PlantMaster 6.0. Here is how you can do this:

1. Go to *My Computer*
2. Click on *local disk (C:)*
3. Find your company logo. It must be a jpg.
4. Highlight or click on the logo.
5. Go up to the menu bar and click on *Edit*. Then click on *copy*.
6. Now look for *Program files* and double click on it to open it.
7. Find *Plantmaster6*. Click on it to open it.
8. Go up to the menu bar and click on *Edit*. Then click on *paste*.
9. Rename the logo to *logo.jpg*

Your company logo will appear on the ePlant screen found in the plant info section of PlantMaster. Your company logo will also appear on every Plant Briefs report you print.
